# **GOLF RULES**

### **Golf Restrictions**

- Each Member is restricted to a maximum of three (3) accompanied guests per day. On a limited basis, the Director of Golf may approve additional guests.
- Each Member will be restricted to a maximum of two (2) tee times per day on the Signature golf course. Additional tee times may be made through the Golf Shop forty-eight (48) hours in advance, subject to availability or on a limited basis approval from the Director of Golf.
- Other restrictions and dates may be determined during the year by Club Management based on demand by Primary Members.

### **Golf Guest Privileges**

- Each Member with golf privileges and his or her spouse will be extended the right to sponsor guests in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Club and subject to the payment of guest fees established by the Club. Children of Members, under the age of 18, cannot sponsor guests.
- Each guest may play the Signature golf course, par 3 golf course or use the practice areas a maximum of five (5) times per membership year regardless of the sponsoring Member. Member guest tournament rounds are excluded from the total number of guest rounds.

# **Golf Starting Times**

- All players must have starting times reserved through the golf pro shop and must register prior to beginning play.
- All play must begin on the first tee unless otherwise arranged by the Golf Team.
- When necessary, twosomes and singles may be grouped together at the discretion of the Golf Team.
- Any group stopping play after nine (9) holes for an extended period of time resulting in an undue delay of the following group, will lose their position on the course and must check with the golf pro shop to resume.
- All tournament or group play must be approved and scheduled in advance by the Club.
- On a limited basis, the Director of Golf reserves the right to allow fivesomes to play the golf course, when not in conflict with normal Member play, and to divide the group if they are unable to maintain their position on the golf course.

### Golf Rules - Children

- Children under sixteen (16) years of age are not permitted on the Signature golf course, par 3 golf course or practice areas without a member unless they have demonstrated to the Golf Team an understanding and respect for the rules and etiquette of the game and an ability to conduct themselves properly on the golf course.
- The Club reserves the right to restrict children of any age from using the Signature golf course, par 3 golf course or practice areas without a member during certain designated days and time periods as determined by the Club.

### **Golf Course Rules**

- The Rules of Golf together with the Rules of Etiquette as adopted by the United States Golf Association will be the rules of the Club, except when amended by any local rules established by the Club or any of the rules herein.
- No practice is allowed on the Signature golf course, including the 19th hole; or The Ridge par 3 course. Practice is restricted to the designated practice areas.
- A brisk pace of play is expected from all players to insure an enjoyable experience for the entire membership. A foursome finishing an eighteen (18) hole round in four (4) hours and ten (10) minutes would be considered an appropriate pace of play.
- If a group is unable to maintain their position on the golf course and is restricting play behind them, they will be required to skip a hole to catch the group ahead of them. For Pace of play rules please see page 16.
- Foursomes will have standing on the golf course at all times. Twosomes and singles should not expect to automatically play through foursomes during busy periods and should not exert undo pressure on foursomes ahead of them.
- The Club may close the Signature golf course, par 3 golf course and/or practice areas during adverse weather conditions, for major repairs or in other instances where the golf courses or practice areas could be damaged by play or practice.
- All players are expected to maintain or improve the condition of the golf course as a result of their round by avoiding wet areas with golf carts, raking bunkers after use, filling divots with seed mix and repairing ball marks on the putting greens.
- Each player must have his or her own set of golf clubs. Rental sets are available through the Golf Shop on a First-come, first-served basis. Rental sets are available for \$70 per set.
- Cellular telephones must be in silent mode and used in an order to not be disruptive to other Members.

• To maximize all our Members/guests enjoyment of the Club, we will ask that you please refrain from using any Bluetooth speakers at the practice facility which includes the tee boxes and short game green. During all Club Championships, you must ask your playing partner(s) for consent prior to playing music on any device. If any Member or Talisker Club staff member asks you to either turn off or turn down your Bluetooth speaker or stereo, please do so.

# **Golf Attire**

- It is expected that Members, their family and their guest(s) will dress in traditional golf attire befitting gentlemen and ladies of a premier private club golf experience. Worn-out or unkempt attire will not be permitted. Any improperly dressed Members, family or guests will be asked to change prior to using the golf facilities.
- Acceptable attire for men on the Signature golf course, or practice areas will include shirts with regular or mock collars and sleeves. Slacks or golf shorts must be worn to the knee. Men's shirts are to be tucked in. Outerwear must be designed for the intention of golf.
- Unacceptable attire for men on the Signature golf course, or practice areas will include, without limitation, sleeveless shirts, t -shirts, sweatpants, casual hoodies, warm-ups, bathing suits, cargo shorts or pants, fitness or tennis shorts and jeans or jean shorts of any color.
- Acceptable attire for women's tops on the Signature golf course, or practice areas should have a collar. Skirts, shorts, and skorts should be of conservative length. Shirts, slacks, capris, leggings and outerwear must be designed for the intention of golf.
- Unacceptable attire for women on the Signature golf course, or practice areas include, without limitation, halter tops, tank tops, t-shirts, sweatpants, casual hoodies, warm-ups, bathing suits, cargo shorts or pants, tennis dresses or shorts, yoga pants, fitness shorts and jeans or jean shorts of any color.
- Hats are to be worn forward facing.
- Golf shoes are required on the Signature golf course and practice areas and must be spikeless. Shoes with metal or ceramic spikes are not permitted anywhere on Club property including the par 3 golf course.
- Members are responsible for informing their guests of the proper golf attire in advance of play. Improperly dressed golfers will be asked to change before using the Signature golf course, par 3 golf course or practice areas.
- Breaches of attire will result in a suspension of club privlidge.

### **Practice Area Rules**

- Practice golf balls are the sole property of the Club and are for use on the practice areas only, use of practice golf balls on the golf course is not permitted. A \$500 fee will be charged for any individual in possession of practice golf balls outside of practice areas.
- To maintain ideal turf conditions, practice golf balls must be hit only from designated areas. Hitting from rough or sides of practice tee boxes is not permitted. Divot patterns on the range should be strictly adhered to as provided for by the golf team.
- Use of private practice golf balls or golf ball shaggers is not permitted.
- Proper golf attire is required at all times while using the practice areas.
- Golf carts are not permitted to park on any turf around the practice areas and must be parked in the designated parking areas.

### **Golf Cart Rules**

- Use of golf carts is optional when playing the golf course as players may choose to walk and carry their clubs. However, the Club reserves the right to make the use of golf carts mandatory at such times and under such terms and conditions as deemed necessary.
- Golf carts may only be used on the golf course when it is open for play and subject to strict adherence to directional signs posted on the course.
- Use of a golf cart is only permitted after it has been properly registered with the golf team.
- Each operator of a golf cart on Club property must be at least sixteen (16) years of age and have a valid automobile driver's license.
- Golf carts are not to be driven off of the Club grounds or to the surrounding residences at any time.
- A maximum of two (2) occupants and two (2) sets of golf clubs are permitted per golf cart.
- A ninety-degree (90°) rule must be used with golf carts when entering the golf course from the cart paths. Golf carts are not permitted to enter any hazards or the native areas of the golf course at any time.
- Golf carts are restricted to the cart paths on all par three holes, in designated curbed areas and around all tee boxes and greens.
- When conditions warrant, the Golf Professional staff will have the authority to restrict golf carts to the cart paths only.
- Private pull carts or battery powered walking carts are not permitted.
- Private golf carts will be permitted if they follow the Club's private cart policies which are reviewed/revised annually and appropriate trail fee are paid.

- The cost of repair to a damaged golf cart will be charged to the member responsible or, in the case of damage by a guest, to the sponsoring member. Members will reimburse the Company, its successors and assignees and/or any operator of the Club for any and all damages sustained from the misuse of a golf cart.
- Each person operating a golf cart accepts and assumes all responsibility for liability connected with the golf cart operation and expressly indemnifies and agrees to hold harmless the Company, its affiliates, their successors and assignees and their respective directors, officers, employees, representatives and agents, from any and all damages, whether direct or consequential, arising from or related to the person's use and operation of the golf cart.

# The Ridge Short Course & Putting Park

The Ridge is designed to provide a fun and accessible experience for players of all skill levels. It features a distinctive 9-hole par 3 course, an 18-hole putting park, and stunning views from both the course and the pavilion.

As a walkable course, The Ridge offers lightweight "Sunday" bags from The Ridge Golf Shop to carry a few clubs and balls comfortably. Carts are allowed only on the maintenance path and are not permitted on the course. The course operates in a relaxed, family-friendly environment with no tee times required. Play is on a first-come, first-served basis. Use the golf ball "Regulator" to secure your spot in line.

New for 2025, "Smidge at The Ridge" brings a casual, lighthearted competition every other Friday evening. **For more details, see page 50** 

### Dress Code at The Ridge:

The Ridge embraces a casual dress code, encouraging comfortable clothing suitable for sports and outdoor recreation. All attire should be neat, clean, and appropriate for a family-friendly environment. Swimsuits and revealing clothing are not permitted. All shoes must have soft soles to prevent damage to the turfgrass.

### **Playing Parameters:**

- All golfers must check-in and register at The Ridge Golf Shop before beginning play.
- Players should choose their teeing area from anywhere on the designated tee boxes for the hole being played.
- Groups are limited to four (4) people or fewer. The Golf Team reserves the right to allow fivesomes on a limited basis.
- Beverage coolers are not permitted on the course unless provided by the Club.
- Mobile phones and speakers should be used in a manner that is not disruptive to other players on the course or the surrounding residences.
- All players are expected to care for the course by raking bunkers after use and repairing all ball marks on putting greens.
- It is the responsibility of each group to keep pace with the group ahead. Please allow faster players to play through.
- Carts (when allowed) must remain on the maintenance path.
- Practice play is strictly prohibited on The Ridge Short Course.
- All pets are strictly prohibited.

# **LIGHTNING POLICY**

If weather conditions at the Club ever pose a risk of injury or become lifethreatening, we strongly urge everyone to take personal responsibility by seeking shelter in a building or vehicle.

Our golf course is also equipped with a state-of-the-art lightning detection system. It is essential that all Members and guests adhere to the Club's policies when lightning warnings are issued.

### **Procedures During Lightning Warnings:**

**Audible Alarm:** When lightning is detected, the system will emit a loud alarm (multiple blasts). At this time, all individuals are required to immediately seek shelter.

**GPS Notifications:** Additional alerts will be sent to the golf cart GPS systems. Upon receiving these notifications, Please proceed to the nearest shelter without delay.

**All-Clear Signal:** The system will monitor lightning activity continuously. Once 30 minutes have passed without a lightning strike, an all-clear horn will sound, *(One long continuous blast)* signaling it is safe to resume activities. <u>Golfers returning to their positions will have priority on the course.</u> Please return to where you last left off on the golf course. Do not skip holes, or cut off other groups.

### **Important Reminder:**

Talisker Club staff do not have the authority to override the system warnings. Please be aware that, in the unlikely event that warnings are not heard or seen, it remains the responsibility of each individual to seek shelter during inclement weather.

# **GOLF COURSE ACCESS**

Walking on the golf course is only permitted when the course is closed or prior to play. When temperatures are below 40 degrees, it is especially important to refrain from walking on turf grass as frost damage can occur. Bicycling or any other form of personal transportation is not permitted on the golf course.

Fishing on the golf course lakes is restricted to when the course is closed, prior to play, or when permissible by the Golf Shop. Single barbless hooks and catch and release are required.

Dogs or any other pets, with the exception of service dogs, are not permitted on Club property at any time except in designated areas. Current designated areas include Moondance Park, the tennis lawn, the south lawn of the Clubhouse and outside the south Tower patio. Dogs or other pets must be on leash at all times, and it is the responsibility of the owner to pick up after them.

# Hole 9 Cart Path Access

Only verified private carts are permitted to use the Hole 9 cart path for transportation between Moondance Park and The Clubhouse. Owners must complete an Acknowledgment and Release Form, which is available at the Member Services Desk. To gain access to the Hole 9 cart path, please visit the Golf Shop to submit the required form.

There are two types of golf carts at Talisker Club.

- A. Course Approved Carts
- B. Commuter Access Carts

Course Approved Carts- Carts are permissible on and off the golf course

Standards for Approval:

- Late model Club Car
- Black in Color
- Beige Seats
- Electric Batteries Only
- Body cannot be altered in any way
- No lift kits
- No knobby tires
- Must be registered with Talisker Club and Insured by Owner. Yearly Trail Fee is required

<u>Commuter Access Carts</u>- Carts are permissible on public roads and the cart path of Hole 9 only. (Cannot be used on the golf course otherwise).

#### Standards for Approval:

- Street Legal (Blinkers, Horn, Lights, Seatbelts)
- Must be registered with Talisker Club and Insured by Owner

# HANDICAP INFORMATION

### **Member Handicaps**

In order to be eligible to play in Club events using handicaps, each of our golf Members must maintain a USGA handicap. Please see the Professional Staff to ensure you are signed up for a USGA handicap. Having a USGA handicap makes the game of golf more enjoyable by enabling players of all abilities to compete on an equal basis. To ensure equitable competitions in our Club events, we are making enhancements as to how Member scores are posted and tracked.

The Professional Staff will monitor the posting of Member scores at Talisker Club. The Professional Staff reserves the right to take further actions against habitual offenders up to and including posting penalty scores and limiting participation in Club-run events.

### Members will have multiple options to post scores:

- 1. Post your score on www.ghin.com from your personal computer or tablet.
- 2. Post your score by utilizing the GHIN mobile app for your smartphone.

# **Unfinished Holes and Conceded Strokes**

A player who starts, but does not finish a hole or conceded a stroke, must record for handicap purposes, the most likely score that they would have made. If a player does not play a hole, the score recorded for that hole for handicap purposes must be par plus any handicap strokes the player is entitled to receive on that hole.

# **Maximum Score to Post**

The maximum hole score for each player to post for handicap purposes will be limited to a Net Double Bogey. The calculation is simple: Par + 2 + any handicap strokes you receive on that hole. Net Double Bogey Max is an effective method to use when your score will not count on a specific hole. IE Team competitions: If you are "out" of the hole please pick up and record your net double bogey max score for the hole.

### Handicap Committee

New for 2025, our Talisker Club Handicap Committee will keep close eyes on handicapping club-wide. It has become apparent that starting this committee is necessary to keep club events fair for every player. Each Talisker Club Member should be properly posting every score, and inflated handicaps will not be tolerated. Handicaps and accurate posting will be monitored weekly by the committee. If you have been suspected or caught falsifying your handicap, you'll be banned from any Talisker Club competition for the year. We take handicapping very serious in protecting our membership and reputation of our Club.

# HANDICAPS & TOURNAMENTS

Members who wish to participate in Club-sanctioned competitions must have a valid GHIN number for WHS Handicap purposes.

### Talisker Club will use max course handicaps to be used in tournaments/playdays Men: 26 Women: 36

Partner Events (Member/Member, Member/Guests (both Men's and Ladies), and Four-Ball Match Play will have a maximum 10 stroke differential in handicaps between partners. The higher handicap index will be adjusted down accordingly.

In the event of a tie, unless otherwise stated in the rules sheet, the USGA recommendation for breaking the tie using the scorecard will be utilized: Last nine hole total, Last six hole total, Last three hole total, and then last hole total.

Registration for weekly events (Ladies Day, Men's Tee it Up, and Couples) will close at 12:00pm, two days prior to the event. Late registrations will be accommodated on a space available basis only.

Cancellations after the registration deadline may result in associated event charges. Majors and Member/Guests have a registration deadline/waitlist policy in force.

Pace of Play in Tournaments will be monitored. If your group is out of position, you may be asked to move to the next tee box and halve the hole.

Talisker Club "Rule of 85" – If your age combined with your handicap index exceed 85, you have the option to move up to the Uinta Tees (Blue/Green Combo). Please advise the Golf Shop staff when registering for an event if you intend to utilize the Talisker Club "Rule of 85".

### Local Rules

USGA Rules govern all play except where modified by the following local rules:

- Penalty Areas are defined by red stakes and lines
- Out-of-bounds is defined by cart paths, white stakes, and lines
- Model Local Rule E-5 (Alternative to Stroke-and-Distance Relief for lost Ball or ball Out-of- Bounds) is in effect for daily play. Please consult each tournaments rules sheet to determine if E-5 is in play.

# PACE OF PLAY

It has become apparent that pace of play is a growing issue at Talisker Club. For the 2025 season, here's what you can expect.

Our "pace of play" target at Talisker Club is 4 hours and 10 minutes for 18 holes, 2 hours and five minutes or less for 9 holes and 1 hour or less for the first 5 holes. Our targets are achievable for golfers of any ability by learning to play "READY GOLF". Your position is determined by the group in front of you, not the groups behind you. We all want to respect each other's time, here are a few simple tips to help you speed up:

- If someone in your group is slow, bring it to their attention, and help them speed up
- Practice "READY GOLF" at all times. Players should be ready to play as soon as it is their turn. Prepare for your shots while others are playing their shots.
- If you hit your drive into the bushes or high desert area, please hit a provisional and keep moving. Additionally, you can use the E5 rule for taking a drop with a two stroke penalty.
- Take multiple clubs to the tee on all Par 3s as well as your laser/range finders to be prepared.
- Mark down scores on the NEXT teeing ground while your playing partners are hitting.
- If you've searched for your ball for three minutes, call it lost and move on. If it's not here, keep it in gear—when it's gone, it's gone!
- When two players are in a cart, drive to the first ball and drop off the player with their choice of clubs. The second player should proceed in the cart to their ball. After the first player hits, he/she should walk toward the cart as the second player is hitting.
- On the tee, pay attention to your partner's shots so that you can best direct them to the proper location.
- When waiting on the tee for the group in front of you to clear, let the short hitter in your group go ahead and play if he/she cannot reach the group in front of you, regardless of the tee played.
- Begin lining up putts as soon as you reach the green. Don't wait to read your putt until it's your turn.
- While on the green, please observe the "Continuous Putting" method. Allowing each player to finish out putting regardless of position. This eliminates time used to mark and realign putts.

### Warnings and Enforcement:

The Golf Staff has full authority to enforce pace of play on the golf course. This may include moving groups to open holes to appropriately space gaps between groups. Your cooperation is appreciated!

- If your group is talked to about falling off pace, it is your responsibility to catch the group ahead of you within the next hole.
- If pace has not been corrected, you will be required to skip the hole. We hope to never arrive at this answer, but we do want it to be known that we take our pace very seriously.
- It is very rare that allowing a group to play through speeds up play. Do not use this method unless advised by the golf team.

#### \*Note, if you have been asked to skip a hole, it will be noted. If any member is asked to skip a hole three times during the course of the season, they'll be suspended from playing in any tournaments or golf events for the season.\*



# **TALISKER CLUB GOLF FAQS**

#### How do I sign up for Club golf events?

You can access sign ups on ForeTees for all golf events, clinics and tee times.

#### How do I schedule a golf lesson?

Private lessons can be requested by calling the golf shop at 435.333.3636. You can also reach out to your instructor directly. For clinics, you can access sign ups on ForeTees.

#### How do I book a round with a PGA Professional that is a guest?

All PGA and LPGA Professionals are welcome to play Talisker Club as your guest, provided they make a courtesy call to our Director of Golf, Travis Alley to seek professional courtesy. The Professional must be in good standing and employed at a PGA facility to be consider for a complimentary round and a Class A Member of the Association. If the Class A Professional is in good standing and a current Member of the PGA/LPGA, the round will be comped. Professionals not in good standing and not employed at a PGA recognized facility are subject to an accompanied guest rate and cart fee.

#### How many times can a guest play in one season?

Guest are limited to 5 rounds per year, no matter what Member they play with. Event rounds, such as Member/ Guests, do not count towards the 5 play limit.

#### I am a new Member. How can I meet other Members?

There are many opportunities to get connected with Members. Please reach out to the golf team as they can help connect you with other golfers with similar handicaps and interests. The Men's Tee it Up game, the Ladies 18 Holers/9 Holers, group clinics, Smidge at The Ridge, and Couples events offer opportunities for new Member engagement.

### Handicap Flag Guidelines

- To obtain a handicap flag from the Golf Shop, a Member must have a documented note from a doctor stating the medical issue for a handicap flag to be used during his/her round of golf.
- Having a handicap flag does not always grant access to fairways. Check with the Golf Staff to confirm golf cart traffic rules for the day.
- The flag will be checked out on a per round basis.
- Golf carts with handicap flags should stay at least 10 yards from all tee boxes.
- Begin to veer around greens when 25 yards away.
- When approaching greens, golf carts should always stay to the side where the cart path runs or flattest area of turf.
- Golf carts should stay on the path on all Par 3's.
- Please do not drive golf carts through the fescue or native grass.

The Golf Shop reserves the right to restrict access off the cart paths to all golf carts due to course conditions and or weather.

With good shots on most holes, golfers are in the vicinity of the putting green without constantly using longer clubs on approach shots, giving more opportunities for pars and some chances for a birdie!! Not to mention your pace of play can improve significantly!

# **HOLE-IN-ONE CLUB**

A Member may be added or removed from the Hole-in-One Club at any time upon request by the Member. All Members who sign up will be charged \$10 per hole-in-one occurrence on the corresponding monthly statement.

A verified hole-in-one must conform to the following guidelines:

- Occur on the Mark O'Meara Signature Course
- The hole-in-one must be witnessed by at least one other Talisker Club Member playing in the same group.
- Only the first ball hit from the teeing ground is official. Mulligans, provisional balls and shots affected by penalty strokes do not count.
- A hole-in-one on a temporary green is not official
- The shot must occur on a day that the golf course is officially open.

If any questions arise as to the validity of a hole-in-one, the decision of the Director of Golf is final.

When a Member of the Hole-In-One Club scores a valid hole-in-one, each Member of the Hole-in-One Club will be billed \$10 to their monthly statement.

The payout to the Member who scored the hole-in-one is as follows:

- Funds to be applied to the Member Credit Book account in the Golf Shop.
- A custom Talisker Club Hole-In-One Gift.

#### Example:

There are 200 Hole-In-One Club Members: 200 X \$10 = \$2000. The \$2,000 is added to the Member's Golf Shop Credit Book account for purchases in the Golf Shop.


